- AOC means 'Any **O**ther **C**olour'
- AV means 'Any **V**ariety'
- Cultivar means same bush or same colour
- All Horticultural exhibits are entered on day of judging

- Pots must not exceed 30cm unless otherwise specified

- Leaves must NOT have been oiled
- All Pot Plants **must be collected** between 9am & 10am **Sunday 25 September**, unless prior arrangements have been made with Stewards

 3rd Stage – Outer petals opening
 4th Stage – Full blown - able to see stamens
 Class 69 3 full bloom roses, must show stamens and pollen
 Class 70 David Austin Rose, 1 cut
 Class 71 1 rose picked from garden neither dressed nor disbudded
 Class 72 1 vase mixed roses, up to 12 stems, own container
